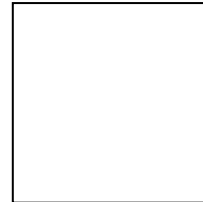

- a) Short films that are submitted must be the entrants' original work and shall not infringe on any copyrights or any other rights of any third parties.
- b) The Department reserves the right to not screen any film(s) for any reason it deems valid.
- c) Racial, religious and regional discrimination shall not be portrayed in any part of the film being submitted.
- d) Contestants agree that they have obtained all required permissions regarding music, sound and/or images presented in your short film.
- e) In case of programmes originally made for television, entries sent in telecast format with commercial breaks, advertisements, channel logos/IDs etc.
- f) Dubbed or revised versions.
- g) Films NOT subtitled in English. (Filmmakers may please ensure that sub-titles are clear and readable. Subtitles should not merge with visuals/background. It would help jury understand the right context and help evaluate the film better. All spoken words should be sub-titled).
- h) Entries received in sub-standard digital quality.
- i) An applicant would be disqualified automatically for consideration of his/her entry if it is found that he /she is influencing any member of the jury.

Note to be taken as per Guidelines issued by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India:-**Language:-**

- Do not use terms such as female foeticide or kanyabhrunhatya, these terms stigmatise abortion and imply that it is not to be provided endangering women who seek abortion for legal reasons.
- Avoid use of language that portrays girls as inferior than boys, objects of pity and devalues them.
- Refrain from using terms such as foeticide, kill, murder, brunhatya, paap etc, as they generate emotions of violence and fear and also target access to safe and legal abortion.
- Avoid holding mothers responsible for Gender Biased Sex Selection as often she has very little control over the matter.
- Use simple and direct messages that enhance value of the girl child and address all issues effectively.

Images:-

- Do not make use of images of foetus being crushed, stabbed and strangled, daggers going through the stomach of the pregnant women, blood being splattered.
- Do not use image of a female foetus speaking from the womb. This tends to ascribe life to the foetus and further the perception of "life being murdered".
- Do not emphasis on the value of women only as brides. This further reinforces their devaluation in perceiving them only in their roles as brides.
- Be careful in selection of images in IEC. Avoid gory and gruesome images of a foetus or a dagger piercing the womb etc.
- Avoid imagery that reinforces stereotypes of gender inequality where men are the providers and women are only the caregivers.

Selection:-

- The decision of selection committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into. Finalists will be notified by mail and/or email.
- The Department reserves the right to accept or reject any film that is likely to offend sentiments, feelings or sensibilities of any caste, community, religion and sector is likely to promote racism or ill will in the society.
