Rashtriya Poshan Maah (National Nutrition Month September 2020)

The POSHAN Abhiyaan (National Nutrition Mission) PM's Overarching Scheme for Holistic Nourishment was formally launched on March 8, 2018 to improve the nutritional status of children, pregnant women and lactating mothers through specific targets for reduction in Low birth weight, stunting, under nutrition and prevalence of Anaemia.

POSHAN Maah

Month of September 2018 was celebrated as Rashtriya POSHAN Maah. The activities in POSHAN Maah focussed on Social Behavioural Change and Communication (SBCC). The broad themes were: antenatal care, optimal breastfeeding (early and exclusive), complementary feeding, anaemia, growth monitoring, girls' - education, diet, right age of marriage, hygiene and sanitation, eating healthy - food fortification.

In view of above, State Family Welfare Bureau, Directorate of Health Services, Goa instructed all 37 peripheral health units to celebrate POSHAN Maah by conducting various activities which are as follows:

Exhibition showing nutritious food items: sources of all nutritive values may be display in the waiting area or any suitable place in the peripheral centre as a part of observance of National Nutritional week.	All beneficiaries attending OPD

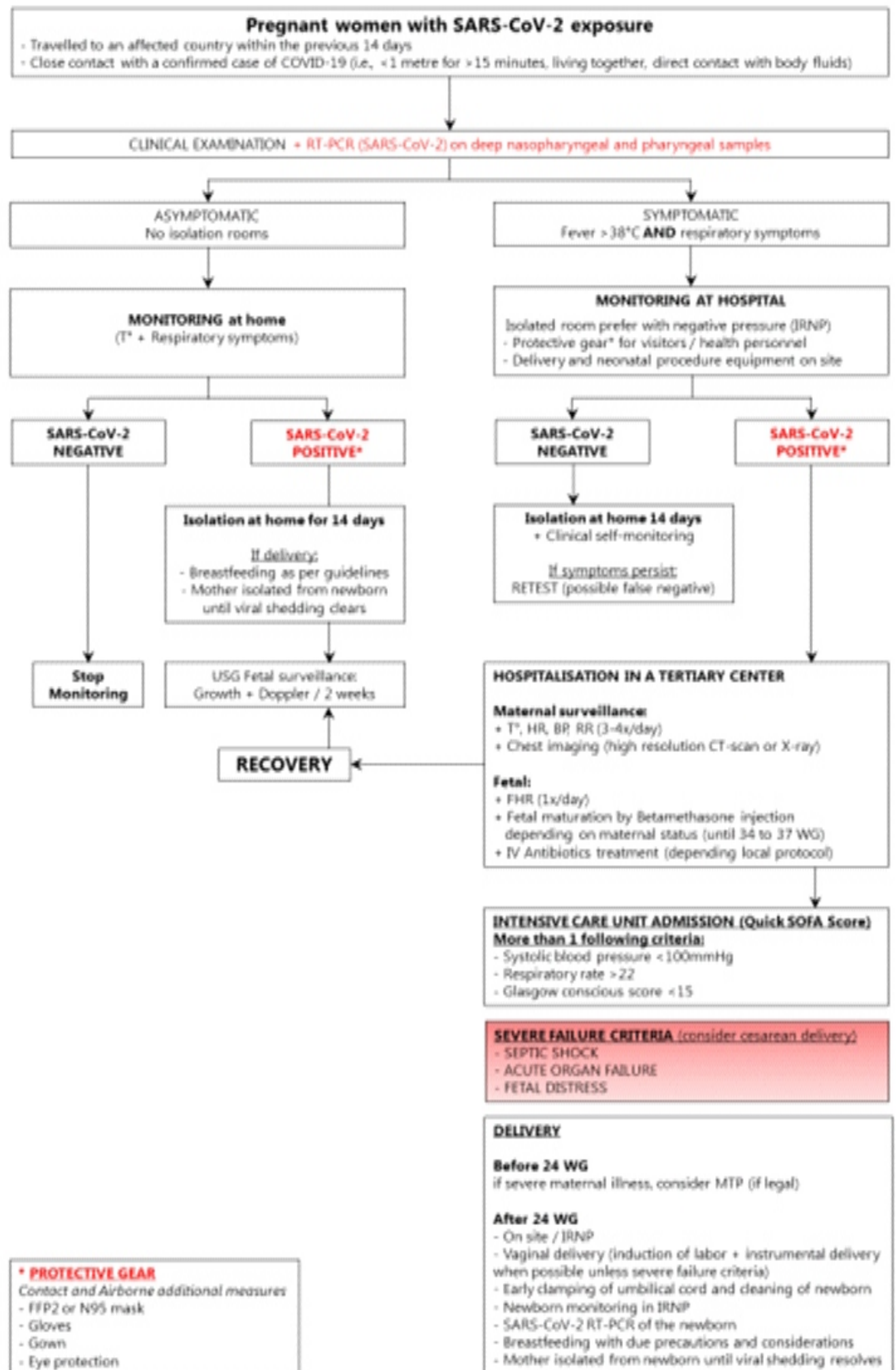

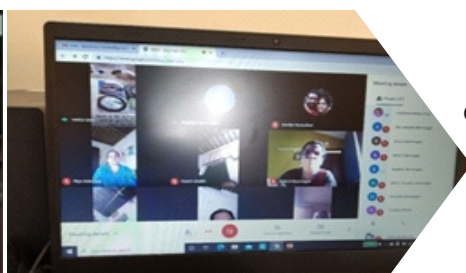

Any new updates/ changes etc. about programme: STEMI-Goa project started by Directorate of Health Services, Goa aims at reducing mortality and morbidity in state due to ST elevation myocardial infarction in Goa. It follows a Hub(1) and Spoke(12) model. Hub being the Goa Medical College and spokes are the Peripheral Health facilities under DHS. The programme has now been scaled up by adding 5 more spokes (CHC Bicholim, PHC Betki, PHC Candolim, PHC Balli and PHC Sanguem) and 3 new Hubs (Victor Hospital, Manipal Hospital and Healthway Hospital). Training of medical officers have been conducted for the implementation of the same.

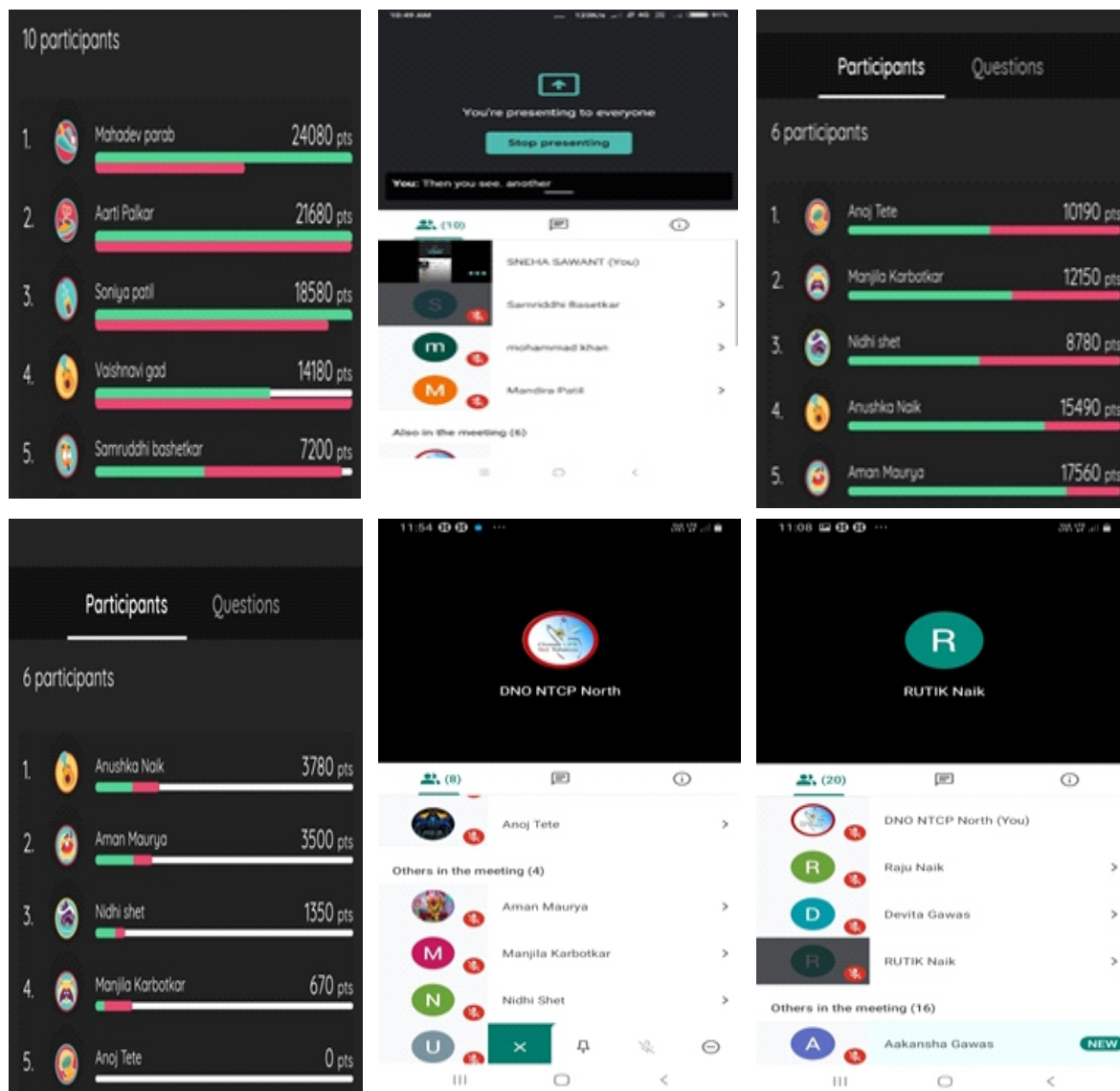

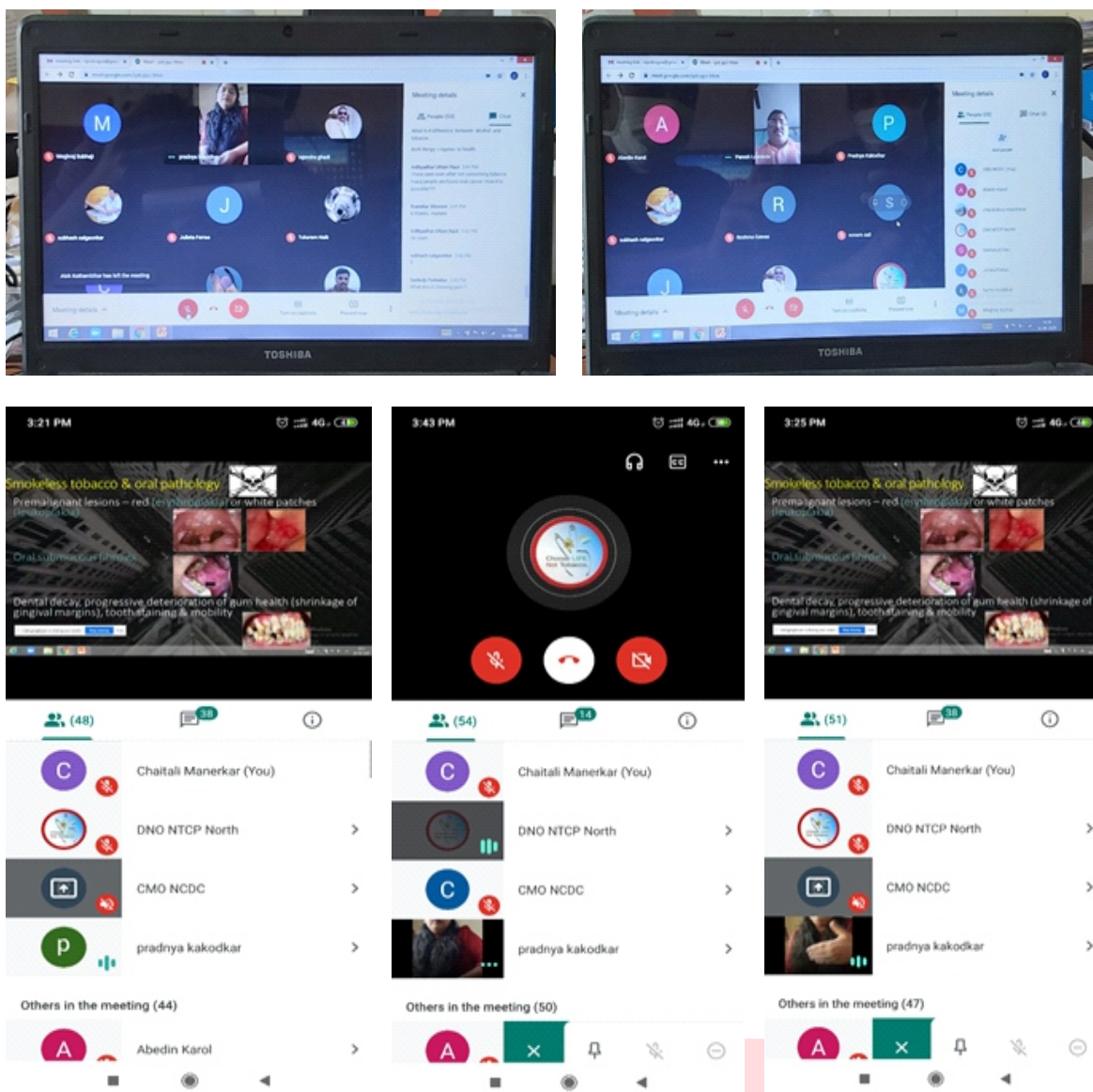

History: World Mosquito Day

World Mosquito Day was observed annually on August 20. Sir Ronald Ross discovered the malaria parasite in mosquito which proved that malaria is transmitted through mosquitos. His relentless efforts ultimately culminated on August 20, 1897 at the Army Hospital for India troops in Begumpet, Secunderabad by observing an oocyst in Anopheles mosquito. His findings laid the foundation for the method for combating malaria globally.

The World Mosquito day is observed to commemorate his discovery in 1897 that female mosquito transmit malaria and to honour his discovery regarding the link between humans, Malaria and mosquito, which changed the health setup considerably ensuring that human can be protected.

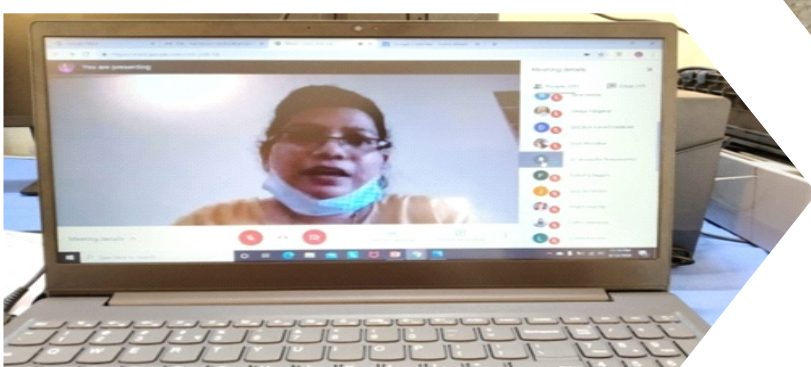

IEC activities/innovative activities conducted by periphery Health Centres:

Some of the innovative ways of IEC/BCC activities conducted by some of the peripheral health centres are as follows.

- 1) As schools are closed due to COVID-19 pandemic some health centre conducted 'webinars' for teachers to create awareness regarding Vector Borne Diseases (VBD).
- 2) Involvement of local Panch/Councillors/MLA of the area during Source Reduction Drive, Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activities along with Health Officials for better result and coverage.
- 3) IEC material like pamphlets printed by the local panchayat and distributed during the door-to-door awareness activities by the local Sarpanch/Panch along with Health Officials.
- 4) A video by a Medical Officer of PHC regarding Vector Borne Diseases (VBDs) was played regularly in the waiting room area during OPD timing to create awareness regarding VBDs to all the patients and their relatives attending the OPD.
- 5) Distribution of LLINs at the construction sites and conducting IEC for the labourers at the site with involvement of the contractor and owner of the construction by following COVID-19 guidelines.
- 6) Scroll messages on prevention and control of Dengue 'Do's and Don'ts' were telecasted on local news channels for creating awareness amongst the general public.
- 7) Miking as a IEC activity was also conducting to create awareness due to increase in COVID-19 cases in that area.

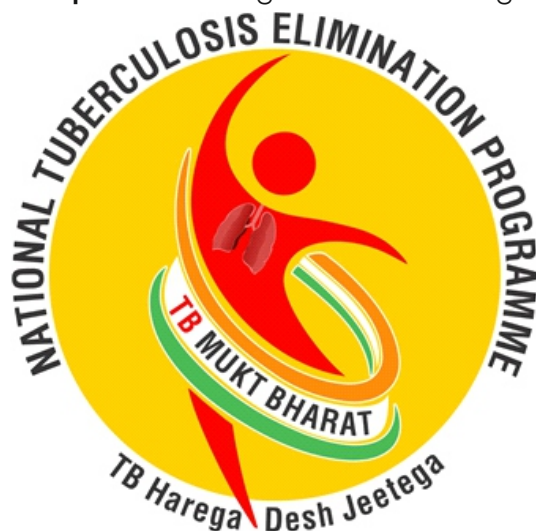

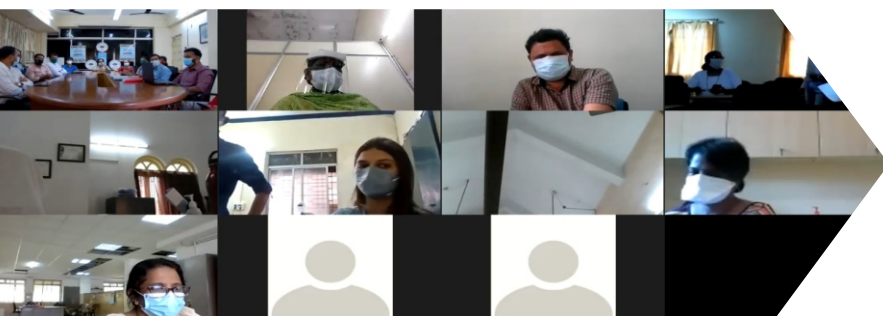
